### Kim's Korner

One of the things that I love about our scriptures is that they are stories of real people, with real experiences and real feelings. If you read the stories of the Bible, they are not stories that are all happy-happy joy-joy, or of people who are always nice and kind and well-behaved (despite what our children's versions of the stories often tell us). The cloud of witnesses from across history demonstrate all kinds of life experiences with very real reactions, from anger to celebration, from joy to despair, from arguing with God (even wrestling with God!), to making a deep life commitment to God and those who choose to walk away from God. The Psalms are about 50% joy-filled, trusting songs of praise or thanksgiving. Yet nearly 70 of them are some kind of song of lament - that is, a Psalm that cries out to God in distress. The psalm writers make no apologies for having feelings and expressing them, and don't say "oh, I shouldn't feel this way." This has been a year of mixed emotions, and in that I have found the Psalms to be helpful in my prayer life. From the election to Thanksgiving, to anxiety about the rising numbers of those affected by the pandemic, to considering what may be next for the life of the church, feelings of grief or thankfulness, anger or excitement, anxiety or joy are cause for lifting our words and feelings up to God. In a month in which we are reminded to express our thanks to God, one of the things I am thankful for is that we can be our real selves with God, even with all of our feelings, and trust that God's love does not leave us. "My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When shall I come and behold the face of God?... I will hope in God; for I shall again praise the one who is my help and my God." Psalm 42:2, 11b Thanks be to God! Pastor Kim
