February 2019 - **The Annual Report**This is my Annual Report. This is not the formal report that will be shared with all the Session, Deacon, and Financial Reports to be received at the Annual meeting, on February 3rd. This is my Annual Report after completing one year as your Interim Pastor.

The first month included a couple of short requests for short sermons during worship services to assemble Hygiene Kits and the Congregational Meeting. It also included at least three snow storms which made for interesting drives to lead worship. I pray that February will not repeat the weather patterns of a year ago. It has been a joy to serve you all during this time of transition. I believe God has been faithful and will continue to strengthen us on our shared faith journey.

We accomplished many tasks during the last twelve months. In the words of Ann, from the The King and I, "I've gotten to know you." We've made a transition from strangers to partners in ministry. I've moved beyond the past and now we look to the future. We successfully walked the bumpy road from being landlords to selling the manse for more than we could imagine. We listened, we discussed, and we decided together, God's direction. The Vision Team worked and will soon share the Mission and Vision Statements. And, we requested permission (and now wait to hear) from the Presbytery COM to elect a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC).

As we transition into the second year of our time together, I expect God will guide us toward a strong and faithful future. The Nominating Committee will meet after the COM meets on January 15th and will present a slate for the PNC. By the time you receive <a href="The Messenger">The Messenger</a>, we hope to move forward in the process. I will be guiding the nominating process focusing on the qualities/characteristics of PNC members or groups of the church that should be represented. We will seek God's guidance

to develop the team who will select your next pastoral leadership. Then, I will step back. I will not be directly involved in PNC process.

Rev. Deb Bergeson-Graham is our Commission of Ministry liaison and she will be working with the PNC, its process to write a Ministry Information Form (MIF), to review Pastor Information Forms (PIF), interviewing candidates, and how to keep the congregation informed of the process without breaking confidentiality. I invite you to pray for the PNC and the pastor as the Lord is preparing to lead you in 2020 and beyond.

#### Per Capita

If you haven't already done so, please remember to pay your per capita assessment, which is \$38.00 for each active member of our congregation as of December 2017. There is an envelope in your box of offering envelopes designated for this purpose. If you did not get envelopes, include a simple note with your contribution that the extra gift is for per Capita.

The operational expenses of the Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly are calculated on a per member (per capita) basis. This year the total per member assessment for Forest Park is \$ (\$38 x 119 confirmed active members = \$4,522). As you are aware, being part of the Presbyterian Church (USA) means that we need to pay our portion of the costs to run the church at its various levels.

Our per Capita dollars support the staff and resources we receive from the PCUSA. We are participating in the Vitality Project of our Presbytery, free of charge because of our support of the Presbytery. The Church Leadership Connection will assist our Pastor Nominating Committee as we seek a new called and installed pastor. Our Synod provides coordination of mission projects in our region. All this is supported through our per capita giving of PCUSA members.

To help the church, each member is invited to pay this assessment by contributing \$38. Thank you to those who have paid their per capita for this coming year, and for those who haven't please do so at your earliest opportunity. Your contribution helps your church in a significant way. Our sincere thanks to you.




There is work for everyone from 2-100 years old to do, from folding towels and washcloths (a sitting job), to counting Band-Aids, to stuffing boxes.

The Deacons have generously donated \$500.00 toward the cost of the kits. If every family could donate \$25.00, we would be well on our way to cover the cost of the kits. What money isn't collected from the congregation, will be covered by Scrip.



A large box in the back of the sanctuary will be used for donations for the Milwaukee Rescue Mission. They are in great need of men's underwear (sizes L, XL, XXL) and women's pajamas (all sizes). The collection box will be in the sanctuary through March. Karen Wimmer, volunteer for the Rescue Mission, has stated, "Your congregation is incredibly generous. When I put out an e-blast for the needs we have, few congregations responded. We are thankful for your support."


